We support people with mild and moderate learning disabilities, from the age of 14 onwards. Some of our Members also have a physical disability. We are dedicated and passionate about what we do, and ensure that people we support with varied needs have choice, and the opportunity to access our unique and popular services. Members can enjoy themselves, but also improve their skills, physical health and wellbeing, communication, social skills and self-esteem as they reach their own potential.



### Referrals

Most people join us as a referral through social care or support workers, or via education; we also welcome people who are referred by a family member. Whatever the referral route, our qualified social worker, or a member of the

Whatever the referral route, our qualified social worker, or a member of the team, will meet with you to discuss your individual needs.

We then offer a taster day and if this is successful for you, we will offer guidance to help you secure funding and then offer a 6-week placement, which usually becomes a permanent place in our service.

We support people who have mild and moderate learning disabilities, who may also have a physical disability or health need. Unfortunately, given the nature of our premises, we are not able to offer support to people who have profound and complex needs and who require significant personal care.
